DEATH OF JOHN PAHL

Lead Call, Monday: John Pahl, father of Mrs. Joseph A Miller and Albert Pahl, of this city, passed away early this morning at battle Mountain sanitarium at Hot Springs from infirmities of old age, complicated by asthma and a severe cold.

Mr. Pahl was born in Hamburg, Germany, January 5, 1850. He came to this country at an early age, and served for ten years in the United States army as farrier. He was one of the few remaining survivors of the Reno expedition, which accompanied the ill-fated band under Gen. Custer on its reconnoiter of the west. Following his discharge from the service, he entered the blacksmithing business at Sturgis.

He was married to Anna Hafer, who preceded him to the grave in 1900. To the union five children were born, four of whom survive him. They are Mrs. Henry Audette and Mrs. Frank Wheat of Chicago; Mrs. Joe A. Miller and Albert Pahl of Lead.

The remains will be brought to Sturgis for burial, and the funeral services will be conducted in the Episcopal Church tomorrow afternoon at 1:30.
